Joe's Icebox Fruitcake

Ingredients:

- $1 \sim 14.4$ oz. Box of Graham Crackers
- $1 \sim 4.5$ oz. Box of Raisins
- $1 \sim 16$ oz. Bag of Chopped Pecans
- $2 \sim 14$ oz. Cans of Eagle Brand
 - Sweetened Condensed Milk

Ingredients:

Using a food processor, grind all the graham crackers into powder form and pour into a large mixing bowl. Add in all the raisins and pecans mixing it thoroughly so that pecans and raisins are well distributed. Add the two cans of milk and mix together until <u>ALL</u> the graham cracker powder is moist. In a sealable container such as Tupperware, line it with cling wrap using enough to overlap each side in order to easily fold over the top after filling it and packing it with the above mixture. Cover top



and pack it tightly. Place it in the freezer over night (or longer). Move to the refrigerator to thaw 24 hours prior to serving. Cut into 2 to 4 inch slices roughly 1/2 inch thick. Enjoy!!! **They are rich but delicious!!!**
